Operation Round Up (ORU)

Another way CLP gives back is through our Operation Round Up (ORU) program. This voluntary

program rounds your monthly electric bill up to the nearest dollar, costing participating members an average of less than \$10 per year.

ORU funds support local nonprofits in our community that apply for assistance. The program is overseen by the Community Trust Board of Directors, separate from the CLP Board of Directors.

In 2025 alone, participating members donated more than \$16,000, helping local nonprofits fund programs, make improvements, and provide vital care to those in our community. If you're not already participating and would like to enroll, you can check the enrollment box on your statement.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIP OF THE MONTH

Winter weather can cause your home heating system to work overtime. Check for air leaks and drafts around doors and windows, then seal them with weatherstripping or caulk. Close fireplace dampers when not in use. and consider installing insulating curtains to help keep warm air inside. You can also save energy by lowering your thermostat a few degrees. Even small adjustments like these can reduce heating costs and improve comfort during the coldest months.




District #1 Director Petition Submission

Pursuant to Section 4.5 of the Cooperative Light & Power's Bylaws, Members from District 1 who are interested in being elected to Cooperative Light & Power's board of directors must submit a petition to the Cooperative on or before January 18, 2026 which is 90 days before April 18, 2026, which is the date of the Annual Meeting.

The petition must be signed by at least 15 Members who have voting rights in District 1. The petition will be available on our website and at our office. Please make sure to get your petition in advance of the deadline in case there are signatures on the petition that are not valid.

A Member may not sign more than one petition except in the case of a joint membership and in that case, both joint members may sign a petition. Completed petitions can be emailed to: careyh@clpower.com or dropped off at the Cooperative's office located at 1554 Highway 2, Two Harbors, MN 55616.

State Law for Active Duty Military

State law offers active military personnel additional payment options for their electric bills. The law covers disconnection, payment arrangements, appeal and annual notice to cooperative members.

Similar to the state's Cold Weather Rule, an application must be completed and income guidelines exist. It's available for active duty military personnel, deployed or permanent duty station change. Member number six hundred seventy three thousand seven hundred twenty seven.

Recipe: Beef or Chicken Pot Pie

From the Kitchen of: Jeff Heinzen

Ingredients:

- 1 9.5" pie pan glass works best
- 1.5 lbs. of stew meat or two boneless chicken breasts, cut into small pieces
- 2 Pillsbury pie crusts 1 18oz. jar of Heinz gravy, beef or chicken
- 1 10-15oz. bag of frozen mixed vegetables · 1 small onion

Instructions

- 1. In a pan, brown the stew meat or chicken and onion, then drain the fat
- 2. Add gravy & mixed vegetables and simmer
- 3. Spray 9.5 pan with Pam cooking
- 4. Add the bottom pie crust
- 5. Pour in the meat & gravy mixture, then add the top crust
- 6. Fold the edge of the crust over the top of the bottom crust
- 7. Cut six 1" slits in the top crust Bake at 300 degrees for 45-60 minutes
